

Our Unique Approach	Quest University Canada is a liberal arts and sciences university in Squamish, British Columbia. Classes are taught on the block plan – you study one course at a time intensively so that you can delve into the subject matter and take advantage of fieldwork opportunities. With classes of no more than twenty, and with students from around the world as your classmates, your experience will be intimate, integrated, and international.
Visit Length	One block minimum (one month); one term (four months); two terms (eight months).
Terms	Fall (September – December); Spring (January – April); Summer (May – July).
Courses Offered	A variety of social sciences, humanities, physical sciences, life sciences and mathematics. Email us for specific course offerings for the period during which you are interested in studying.
Tuition	Tuition is \$3250 per block, or \$13,000 per term (based on 2010-2011 Academic Year).
Residence	Quest is a residential university – all students live on campus, and have a meal plan. Our residences are two-bedroom condos, with the option of shared or private bedroom, with shared kitchen and living space in each condo. Prices for one term range from \$4,200 to \$5,650 CAD for room and meal plan, depending on the choice of shared or private bedroom. All condos have high-speed wireless internet service, and shared laundry facilities.
Meal Plan	The Quest cafeteria is open from 7 am to 7 pm daily. Options include vegetarian and vegan items, bakery items, grill, salad bar, sandwich bar, soups and stews, and daily specials. The meal card works like a debit card, with a declining balance based on items purchased.
Health Insurance	Visiting students who are not Canadian citizens are automatically enrolled in the Student Guard Health Insurance Plan. The cost is approximately \$60 per block / \$240 per term.
Recreational Facilities	Visiting students have full access to the Athletics Complex, which includes squash courts, weight room, basketball court, and an all-weather outdoor soccer pitch. Outdoor recreational equipment, including mountain bikes and snowshoes, can be signed out for personal use.
Co-curricular Activities	Visiting students fully integrated into the campus community at Quest, and are encouraged to participate in events including guest lectures, live music, trips to Vancouver and Whistler, yoga classes, media-based workshops, and student council activities.
Deadline	Application deadlines depend on term and length of study.
Eligibility	To be eligible to apply as a visiting student, students must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • normally have completed at least one year of full-time university studies; • be in good academic standing; • meet the English language requirements if English is not their first language; • have a letter of recommendation.
